





The Coastal Federation COVID-19 Catch-Up Funding Plan

Teachers and families across the country have provided extraordinary support to help children learn at home during the Covid-19 pandemic. However, for many children, the disruption caused by school closures will have had a negative impact on learning and wellbeing.

The government has announced £1 billion of funding to support children and young people to catch up. This includes a one-off universal £650 million catch-up premium for the 2020 to 2021 academic year to ensure that schools have the support they need to help all pupils make up for lost teaching time.

Schools' allocations will be calculated on a per pupil basis, providing each mainstream school with a total of £80 for each pupil in years reception through to 11. This funding will be provided in 3 tranches starting in the Autumn Term.

Teaching

- A broad and balanced curriculum that focuses on vocabulary acquisition.
- Specialist interventions to help children improve their speech and language skills.
- Whole class reading approach
- Support and empower subject leaders to develop their research and leadership skills to improve CPD opportunities for all.
- Behaviour and therapeutic CPD sessions, to help staff when implementing support and provisions for children who may struggle with their return to school.
- Support children's knowledge through construction of knowledge organisers for topic curriculum subjects.

Targeted Academic Support

To enable improved access to the curriculum:

- Children have access to an online Reading and Spelling intervention programme which can be used in school or at home.
- Provide daily intervention to improve speech and language
- Same-day in-class interventions run through independent study time with teachers and teaching assistants
- Children have access to an online times tables and mental maths resource which can be used at home.
- Provide grammar and punctuation help sheets to parents

Wider Strategies

To enable access to a blended learning model:

- Provide ongoing technical support for parents with the use of Google Classroom.
- Extensive outdoor learning provision.
- Ensure our most vulnerable pupils have priority access to classroom teaching and online materials.
- Ensure pastoral contact home for disadvantaged children.
- School staff used to cover classes rather than supply staff.
