Isle of Wight Residential Week - July 2024

We have provisionally booked 'The Isle of Wight Experience' for Year 6's residential from 15th-19th July 2024. This is the final week of the year. All normal end of year activities i.e leaver plays, parties, assemblies will happen in the preceding week. This visit will hopefully give them the confidence boost they need before their start at high school in September - a chance to start the journey to independence.

It will likely include; a visit to [HMS Victory](#) in Portsmouth, a boat cruise to see [The Needles](#) and [The Old Battery](#), Fossil Workshops, [Black Gang Chine](#) theme park, [Brading Roman Villa](#), Shanklin Theatre and many other team building activities. Included in the subsidised cost of *£297 (normal cost of £395) and £198 for Pupil Premium/LAC children) is the coach, ferry, accommodation and food in our very own private hotel - specially designed for school parties. We will offer staged payments for this residential visit.
